

Pennsylvania S.S.

In pursuance of a Warrt. dated the 13th Day of October A.D. 1760. There was Surveyed by William Maclay Deputy Surveyor Three Islands in the River Susquehanna. One of them situate below McKees half Falls and near McKees big Island. Containing Two acres witho^ut allowance. Another of them situate a little above the Mouth of Mahatango on the west side commonly called McKees Turkey Island containing Twenty six acres with the Usual allowance of 6 p. Ct. The other of them near the west side of said River a little below the Mouth of Mahatango Containing Eleven Acres & fifty perches & allowance of 6 p. Cent.

Returned into the Secretaries Office the 30th day of March 1768.
