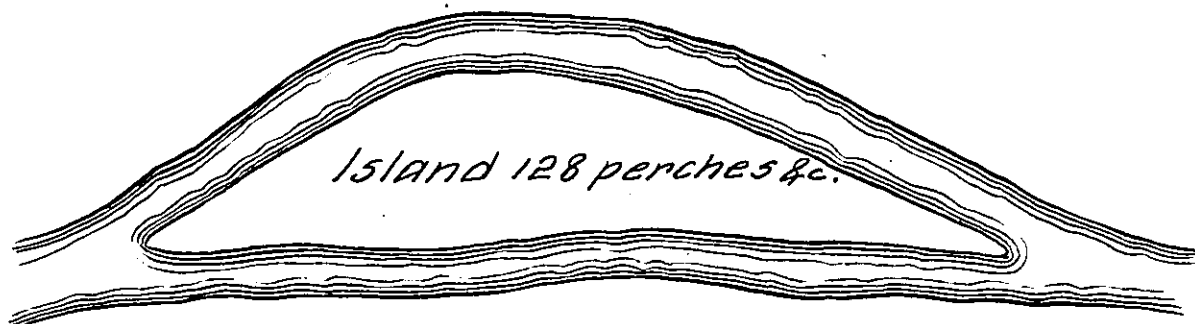

Pennsylvania S.S.

In Pursuance of a warrant bearing date the 13th day of October 1760 granted for the surveying all the Islands in the River Susquahanna, Delaware the Lehi &c. I have caused a survey to be made for the Honble. Proprietaries of a Small Island in the West Branch of Delaware. Commonly called The Lehi not far from the Town of Easton have^{ing} the Lands of James Fulston to the Northward, & the lands of Melcher Hoy To the Southward. being in length about thirty six perches & in breadth in the widest place about seven perches & containing Three Quarters of an acre & Eight perches of Land & allowance of Six pcent Returned into the secretaries Office The first Day of March 1773.
