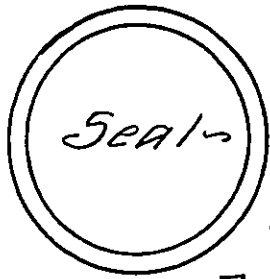


Pensilvania 5.5.



By the Commissioners of Property.

Upon an Agreement made with Richard Lewis of Guyned for three Hundred Acres of Land near Perquainink Creek whereon Robert Edward in <sup>his</sup> life time made some improvement for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Ninety Six Pounds four Shillings <sup>for the whole</sup> and the usual yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every Hundred Acres These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Richard Lewis the Said Quantity of three Hundred Acres of Land Contiguous to the Surveys already made by the Said Land including w<sup>th</sup>in the same the Said improvement and make a Return thereof into the Secretary Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 19<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> month Anno Dni 1715
