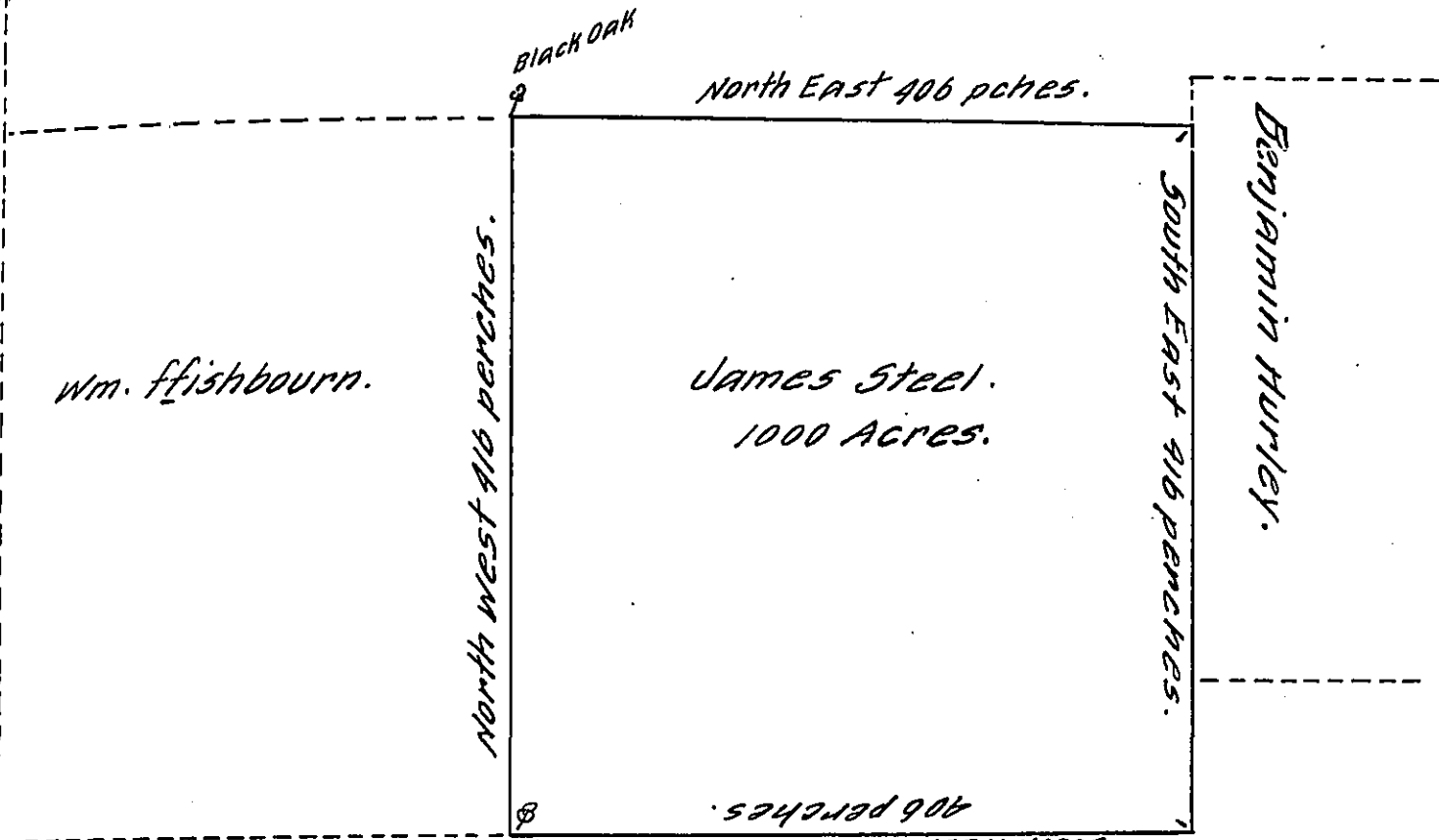

In Pursuance of a Warrant under the hands and seals of Charles Read Job Goodson George Fitzwater and Joseph Pidgeon Trustees for the free Society of Traders in Pennsylvania dated the 25th day of March in the Year 1724 Requesting me to Survey [or cause to be Surveyd] unto James Steel one Thousand acres of Land in this Province in Part of 20000 acres Purchased by the said Society. This may certify that on the 16th day of April in the same year there was Surveyd to the said James Steel a Certain Tract of Land in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a White Oak at a Corner of William Fishbourns Land in ^{or} near the Boundaries of Warminster Township and running thence North West by the said Fishbourn's Line four hundred and Sixteen perches to a Corner Black Oak. Then by Land reputed vacant North East four hundred six perches to a Corner post in a line of Benjamin Hurley's Land Then by the same South East four hundred and sixteen perches to another corner post Then South West by a Line of Marked trees four hundred and Six pers. to the Place of Beginning Containing the Above mentioned quantity of One thousand Acres Returned into the Secretary's Office the 30th day of April, 1724.
