

Pennsylvania, s.s. By Vertue of a Warrant from the Commissioners, dated the 9th of the 3d. Month 1689 Directed to the Surveyor General to make Return of a Tract of Land. Surveyed & laid out by a Verbal Order the 19th of the 12th Month 1686/7 unto William Markham, as likewise of a Tract of five hundred Acres laid out Contiguous unto the same for Jacob Pellison.

Surveyed the same day. Both which are situate lying and being in the County of Philadelphia. I do by Authority from the Surveyor General certifie into the Secretary's Office that the said Land was laid out accordingly unto them.

Beginning at a Corner Tree standing at the North west end of the Susquehanna Indian Town thence N.E. by a Line of Trees 963 perches, thence S.E. by a Line of Trees 600 perches, thence S.W. by the Mannor of Gilberts 633 perches to a Corner Tree of the same standing by the Schuylkil, thence up the several Courses thereof to the place of Beginning.

Containing [including the said Pellison's 500 acres] 3500 acres Returned the 19th of the 5th. Month 1689.
