

The Discription of Clement Plumsted's & James Steel's Meadow Ground taken from their Deeds from Able Noble C. P's. Beg 9 at a Corner Post set in the Ground being also a Corner of James Steel's Cripple from thence North by a Line of marked Trees @ 37 per. to a Corner marked Hickery being also a Corner of George Fitzwater's Cripple Thence East 3 Degs. South dividing between the said Clemt. Plumsted & the sd. George George Fitzwater's Cripple & Meadow 28 per to a post for a Corner Thence S. 3. W. 35 per. to a Post Then west by James Steel's Cripple 25 per to the place of Beg 9 5 1/2 as.

J. S. Beg 9. at a Corner marked Beech Tree being also a Corner of other ~~the~~ Cripple of the sd. J. Steel from thence West 23 per to a Corner marked Ash. Thence by other Cripple of the sd. Able Noble North 29 per to a Post. Then East by Clemt. Plumsted 25 per to a post. Then S 3 W by other Meado. of J. Steel 29 1/2 per. to ye Beg 9. 4 Acres.
