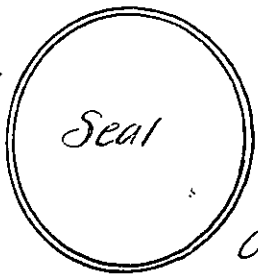


Pensilvania S.S.

At the Request of Nathaniel Parke in behalf of himself and his Wife Elenor who came into this Province Servants to Nathaniel Evans in the Year 1681 That we would Grant him to take up his and his Said Wifes proportion of head land according to the Proprietors Original Concessions. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Surveyed to the S<sup>d</sup> Nathaniel according to the Method of Townships appointed, fifty Acres for himself and fifty for his Said Wife, of Land in this Province that has not been Surveyed nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians, ~~and to make~~ to be held under the Yearly Quitrent of one half penny Sterling p acre, And make Returns thereof into the ~~General Surveyors~~ Secretaries Office, Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 4<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> April in the 6<sup>th</sup> Year of the Reign of Queen Anne A.D. 1707.
