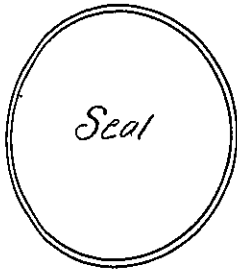


Pensilvania



William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in Chief of the
Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed

At the Request of Christopher Pennock That I would grant him a Resur-
vey on a Tract of Land in the Liberties of the City of Philadelphia beyond
Skuykill laid out to George Collet and Company for a hundred
Acres: These are to Require thee forthwith to Resurvey or cause to be
resurveyd the Said Tract, according to the first Bounds and Lines
of the former Survey, and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries
Office, Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 12th
day of the eighth Month 1700.
