At the Request of William Passmore that we would Grant him to take up the quantity of five hundred acres of Land in ~~part~~ <sup>full</sup> of one Thousand Acres purchased of the late Proprietor by Richard Webb of Kingston upon Thames by Deeds of Lease & Release dated the 26<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup> dayes of October Anno 1681 who by like Deeds dated the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>d</sup> dayes of December Anno 1684 Granted & Conveyed the Same Land unto Abraham Bonyfield whose Son & Heir Abr<sup>m</sup> Bonyfield by other like Deeds dated the 22<sup>d</sup> & 23<sup>d</sup> dayes of June Anno 1722 Granted and Released the whole unto the Said William Passmore his heirs & Assignes forever — These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd unto the Said William Passmore in Right of the purchase made of the Proprietor as aforesaid, According to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land (the proportion of Liberty Land <sup>for one thousand acres</sup> being first Deducted) that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make Returnes thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation, Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 4<sup>th</sup> Month Anno D<sup>n</sup> 1725.
