Whereas there has at several times been granted by ye propri-
etary & his Com^{rs} unto Xtoph^r Pennock, Joseph Pennock or others ye
Quantity of four thousand One hundred & Sixty five Acres of Land or
thereabouts in right of Francis Francis Rogers & George Rogers their
Original purchases of ffive thousand acres as by an acco^t of ye s^d Lands
(including our Grant of this Dayes Date to ye S^d Joseph Pennock) is
made appear, but whether any more than ye s^d quantity has been
hitherto Paid out is not yet Certain, And Whereas ye S^d Joseph being
abo^t to Depart from this province & Return to Europe hath requested
us that we would Grant him to take up ye remainder of ye s^d Purchase now
devolved to him w^{ch} he Computes to be abo^t Eight hundred & thirty five
acres: These therefore are to Authorize & and Require thee to Survey
& Lay out according to ye Method of Townships appointed to ye S^d
Joseph Pennock ffive hundred acres of Land in thy province where
not already Surveyd nor taken nor is Conceald nor Seated by ye Indians
To hold ye s^d 500^a to ye S^d Joseph his Heirs & Assigns provided that
it shall not hereafter appear that there is so much ^{not yet} Laid out ~~at~~ or granted
of ye purchases afore s^d. And make returns into ye Gen^l Surveyors Office
at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to remain & a Copy thereof to be Deliv^d
to thee Certified by ye Secretary, Given under our hands & ye Seal
of ye province at Philad^{ia} ye 23-12 m^o 1702. —
