

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and Seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 9<sup>th</sup> day of the 5<sup>th</sup> month 1700 I do hereby Certify that I have caused to be surveyed unto Nathaniel Puckle in right of William Wade old purchaser of twelve hundred and fifty Acres a certain Tract of Land situate in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a Corner post dividing it from Richard Hains's Land, from thence North East five hundred perches by a Line of Marked trees to another post Sett in the ground hard by a marked White Oak, from thence by a Line of marked trees North West Ninety Six perches to a Corner post dividing it from Joseph Tanners Land, from thence by a Line of marked trees South West five hundred perches to another Corner post of the said Joseph Tanners Land, from thence by a Line of marked trees South East Ninety Six perches to the first mentioned corner post, Containing and laid out for three hundred acres of Land, Surveyed the 21<sup>st</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1701, and Returned according to the above said Survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governour's Secretary's Office the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1701
