*At the Request of Richard Parker of Darby that we would Grant him to take up Two hundred & fifty acres of Land part of Thomas Hudsons purchase of ffive Thousand Acres afterwards Sold to Samuel Thorne (& others of Long Island) under whom by Several Deeds the said Richard Parker now holds, These are to authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd unto the Said Rich<sup>d</sup> Parker according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of Two hundred and fifty Acres of Land that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary Office in Order for a further Confirmation,*

*Given under our hands & the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the ffirst Month Anno Din 1720*
