These are to authorize and require you to Survey & lay out in Right and as part of our Tenths the Quantity of Fifteen hundred Acres of Land on the West Branch of Susquehanna at the Mouth of Muncey alias Cannas-arago alias Ooachpochery Creek to include the Mouth ^{of} the Creek and to extend down the River above a Mile So as to include a Mine on the East Side of the River at or near the Mouth of a Small Run, and also the good Land thereabouts, And make Return thereof into our Secretaries Office for our Use And for your so doing this shall be your Sufficient Warrant, Witness John Penn Esq^r Lieutenant Governor of the Said province who by virtue of certain powers from the Said proprietaries hath hereunto set his Hand & caused the Seal of the Land Office to be affixed at philad^a this twenty fourth Day of November in the Year One thousand Seven hundred & Sixty eight.
