Tilghmans Order to Survey from Wyalousing to Owegy

Sir

Land Office August 14<sup>th</sup> 1773

I desire you will order to be laid out for the use of the Proprietaries under your General Warrant to Survey their tenths, ten thousand Acres of Land upon Wyalousing Creek on the North East Branch of — Susquehanna — and on the River or any of the Waters of it about Wyalousing Town or between that and Owegy, — in several tracts, so as to take good Land which is not already appropriated, but great care must be taken not to Survey any on the West Side of the River above the Creek Called Awandæ or Towandæ that being the boundary of the Indian Purchase on that Side.
