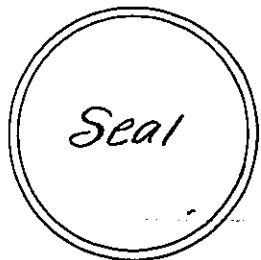


Pennsylvania S.S.

These are to authorize and require you to Survey and lay out for our Use the quantity of Twelve hundred and fifty Acres of Land, <sup>on the West Side of Susquehanna in Cumberland County,</sup> adjoining the line or bounds of the Purchase in 1754 & extending upwards along the River to the Falls and to make Return thereof into our Secretarys Office, And for so doing this shall be your Sufficient Warrant.

Witness John Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> Lieutenant Governor & Commissioner of Property of the Said province who by virtue of Certain powers from the Said proprietaries hath hereunto Set his Hand and caused the Seal of the Land Office to be affixed at Philadelphia, this twenty Seventh Day of December One thousand Seven hundred & Sixty Eight.
