

At a Meeting at the Governors on Monday the first Day of April 1776

The Governor taking into Consideration the State of the Out Lots of Sunbury already apply'd for and the Proprietary Lands adjoining the Town; as also the Petition of Sundry Inhabitants of the Town who have not been accommodated with Out-Lots, came to a Resolution to grant the Out-Lots already apply'd for on Leases for twenty One years and order'd The Surveyor General with Mr William Maclay to lay out a number of additional Out-Lots of a convenient Quantity each, interfering as little as possible may be with the improved Grounds which Captⁿ Samuel Hunter has been allowed to possess, to be let out upon Leases as afo^s. And also to lay out the remaining part of the Manour of Pomfret into convenient Plantations from fifty to three hundred Acres to be leased upon such terms as Applyers may agree upon, The Manour at Muncy is also ordered to be laid out into five convenient Tracts for Plantations. Doctor Alison applys for fifty Acres of Land upon such Terms as the other Proprietary Lands are disposed of, situated about a Mile above Fort Augusta on the North Branch of Susquehanna between the Gut the Hill and a Small Run to include a Spring and a Small piece of Clearing began by Mr Maclay, And the Surveyor General is order'd to view the Ground and have it laid out in a convenient Manner
