*In pursuance of a warrant dated the 13th day of October 1760 locating and requiring the then Surveyor General to Survey or cause to be Surveyed for the use of the Honble Proprietaries all the Islands in the River and Creeks in the Province purchased of the Indians.*

*In pursuance of which warrant I have caused the three following Islands to be Surveyed viz One of them Surveyed the 18th of December 1769. Situate in the West Branch of Susquehanna Opposite John Lee's Settlement Contain- ing twenty one Acres and twenty two perches and allowance of 6p Cent & ca. The other two Situate in the River Juniata one of them Surveyed the 10th day of October, 1760. below the Mouth of Cockelamus Creek and opposite the Land of Graft Course Containing Five Acres and one hundd. and forty two perches and allowance of 6p Cent & ca. And the other Surveyed the 2d day of September 1769 opposite the Plantation late John Lycan's Contain- ing Two Acres and Seventy eight perches and allowance of 6p Cent & ca.*

*Returned into the Secretary's Office the 19th day of March 1770.*
