Begin^g at a Corner marked Hickery Tree being the upper Corner of Passyunk, thence by the Passyunk Line of marked Trees North 272 p to a Corner marked Spanish Oak being the upper Corner of Passyunk Lands thence N.E. by a line of marked Trees 116 p. to a Corner marked Swamp Oak Standing by Shackanoing being the Corner Tree of Wicoco Land, then S.E. by S. by the 5^d Land 300 p to a Corner marked White Oak by the Swamp Side, thence by it on Several Courses to a Mulberry Tree on Ranken's Hook, thence on the Several Courses of the said Hook and meadow to a Corner marked Oak Sapling at the Head of the said Hook, from thence by the Several Courses of the Swamp to the place of Beginning, contain^g 525^{as} Granted by Vertue of a Patent to Martin Glen-smith, William Stille & Lawrence Andrews from Hoynoyass a Governour of the South River in America dated the 6th of the 4th M^o 1664. Wh^o bl Tract was Resurveyed to Lawrence Andrews, Andrew Bankson ^{obl} Stille & John Matson the present possessors & equal Sharers, ^{obl} Warrant from William Penn Proprietary & Govern^r, dated the 13th ^{obl} 4th M^o 1683 and surveyed the 20th day of the Same Month.
