Contains fifty eight Acres and an half with allowance.

MAY 5th 1769 agreed with Thomas Bernard for this Island for £100 to pay £50 Down in 3 Mo. the remaining £50 in 12 Mo. with Interest and half penny acre Quit rent Richd. Hockley.
