At the Request of Thomas Smith of Concord that we would grant him five hundred Acres of Land towards Sasquehannah for w<sup>ch</sup> he agrees to pay to the Proprietors Use within three Months after Survey fifty pounds for the whole together with the usual quitt<sup>t</sup> of One English shilling for each hundred acres yearly forever. These are to Authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said Thomas Smith according to the Method of Townships the Said quantity of five hundred acres of Land that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make Returns into the Secretaries Office Which Survey in case the said Thomas fulfill the said Agreemt Shall be valid otherwise the same shall be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrt ever granted. Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philad'l the 6<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> Month A.D 1715
