At the Request of Randal Spakeman Administrator on the Estate of Daniel Smith deceased That We would grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in the County of Chester for the Use of the Said Daniel's Estate and in right of several mean purchases made by him of Original Purchasers from the Proprietary: These are to require thee forthwith to survey and lay out to the s^d Randal Spakeman according to the Method of Townships appointed, and for the Use aforesaid the said Number of five Hundred Acres of Land in the Said County where not already survey'd nor taken up, nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians, and make returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the sixth of the 2^d Moth 1702
