At the Request of Jacob Sirmcock That We would grant him a Resurvey on two hundred acres of Land part of two hundred and eighty acres Sold by the Sherif of Chester County to Thomas Holme to satisfy a debt due to him from Charles Ashcorn being part of a Tract of 330 Acres taken up by the s^d Charles on the North side of Crum Creek in y^e said County by Vertue of the Propriet^rs Warr^t; These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey the said two hundred and eighty acres according to the old Lines and first bounds of Survey and to run the division Line exactly between the said Jacob and Richard Crosby in whose possession the ~~80~~ remaining 80 acres now is or lately has been, and make Distinct Returne of the s^d Tract reputed to contain 200 acres into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary.
