At the Request of Richd Parker of Philad^a Agent for Richd Snead of Bristol Merch^t That Whereas there was by mistake laid out to the s^d R Snead a certain Tract of Land of 1250 acres within the Bounds of the Welch Tract and on Settlement^s made therein, great part of w^{ch} he is now obliged to Surrender and acquitt to those who have settled the same & enjoy it by a prior Right, We would therefore grant him a Resurvey on the s^d Tract of Land with Liberty to cutt off for his s^d Constituent from the Said Tract So much thereof as is not taken up by the s^d Settlers: These are in Compliance with his s^d Request to Authorize and Require thee to Resurvey the s^d Tract of Land laid out as afores^d and to cutt off from y^e Same for the s^d Richd Snead So much thereof as is not entred upon or can conveniently be Spared by the s^d Settlers with & by their own free ~~consent~~ Consent, and make Returns thereupon as Well of the Settem^ts of the s^d Welch in or upon any part of y^e s^d Tract in pursuance of their respective Warr^ts as of what thou shalt so cutt off into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^a wherethis Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be del^{vd} to thee certified by y^e Secretary, Given under our hands & y^e Seal of y^e Province at Philad^a 14th Xth 1702
