Upon an Agreement made with George Smedley of the County of Chester for Two hundred Acres of Land or thereabouts of that Vacancy left adjoining to his other Land in Willistown in y<sup>e</sup> County of Chester, for which he is to pay to the Proprietors Use five and forty pounds upon or before the Nine and twentieth day of September next with y<sup>e</sup> Common Quitrent of the Province for ever hereafter, These are to Authorize thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to y<sup>e</sup> said George Smedley in y<sup>e</sup> place aforesaid the Said quantity of Two hundred Acres or more if he desire it ~~is~~ in proportion to the Rate above mentioned to be cutt off from y<sup>e</sup> rest of the Vacant Land there, by a Streight Line extending to both sides of the said Vacancy and running parallel, or nearly so, to y<sup>e</sup> Outer Line of the Land he holds and make a Return thereof into the Secretaries Office, Which Survey in case the s<sup>d</sup> George comply with y<sup>e</sup> afores<sup>d</sup> agreement (or before y<sup>e</sup> first day of November next) shall be Valid, otherwise the Same shall be void as if it had never been made nor this Warr<sup>t</sup> ever Granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> y<sup>e</sup> first day of the sixth Month A.D. 1713.
