Whereas John Sanger of the County of Chester hath Made it appear to us that he came with the first adventurers a serrant into this Province to John Bezer and hath there upon requested us that we would Grant him to take up his right in head Land in this Province pursuant to y^e Proprio^{rs} Concessions in that Case made and granted these are to authorise and Require thee to survey or Cause to be survey'd to y^e sd John Sanger fifty acres of Land in the County of Ches- ter where not already survey'd nor taken up nor is Concealed nor seated by the Indians and Make Returns thereof into the secretary's office. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 29th day of 9^{br} 1709.
