then and there to testify all and singular those things which you  
shall know in a certain plea of Trespass and Ejectment wherein  
Samuel Seckright, Lessee of the hon<sup>ble</sup> Thomas Penn and John  
Penn, Esquires, is Plaintiff, and Robert Palston is Defendant.  
then and there to be tried by a jury of the country; and here-  
of fail not, under the penalty of one hundred pounds, Witness,  
William Allen, Esq; Chief Justice of our said province, at Philadel-  
phia, the twenty first day of August in the thirteenth year of our  
reign, Annoque Domini One thousand seven hundred and seventy  
three.*
