

By Order and direction from the Govern^r & Com^{rs} for setting out lands to the purchasers in pennsylvania &c. I hereby authorize thee to Survey and lay out up Pemapecca Creek, next after my former warrant, on the western side thereof, viz; after one thousand acres by that side is laid out, then next after the said thousand acres, lay out to John Sumner four hundred and Ninety acres, and next lay out to W^m Smyth the like quantity of four hundred & ninety acres, and next lay out the like quantity of four hundred & ninety acres unto James peters, observing the rule of twenty pole to the hundred, if the place backward will bear it, and to returne to me a true duplicate of the field work and protracted figures, which are to remain in my office. Dated this 12th of Apr 1682.
