To John Lukens Esquire Surveyor General of the Province of Pennsylvania Greeting We Command you that laying aside all Business and Excuses whatsoever you personally be and appear before one or more of his Majesty's Justices of the Supream Court of the Province of Pennsylvania at a Nisi prius Court to be held at Chester for the County of Chester the twenty seventh day of March next to testify all and singular those things which you shall know in a certain Plea of Trespas and Ejectment wherein Samuel Seckright Lessee of the honorable Thomas Penn and Richard Penn Esquires is Plaintiff and John Major is Defendant then and there to be tried by a jury of the Country And that you bring along with you the four several Surveys of the Lands said to be the Property of Sr Mathias Vincent & Co. and Dr Cox to be shewn in Evidence to the jury aforesaid on the Trial of the said Plea on the Part of the Defendant and herein fail not under the Penalty of One hundred Pounds, Witness William Allen Esquire Chief Justice of our Said Province at Philadelphia the Seventh day of October in the eighth Year of our Reign
