At the Request of Joseph Sterman late of Germany but now of this Province that we would grant him to take up ~~some~~<sup>towards</sup> Conestogo one hundred acres of Land for which He agrees to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> Use Ten pounds Money of Pensylvania and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for the same These are to Authorize & Require thee to survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Joseph Sterman in the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of one hundred acres of Land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys office w<sup>ch</sup> Survey in case the said Joseph fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands & the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 10<sup>th</sup> day of y<sup>e</sup> 3<sup>d</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> anno Din 1718
