At the Request of George Steward that we would grant him to take up near Sasquahanna River the quantity of Two hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Proprietary Trustees Twenty ^{Money of Pennsylvania} pounds ~~for the whole~~ and the Yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said George Steward in the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the Said George fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made or this Warr^t ever granted Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^a y^e 16th of 9th anno Din 1719
