At the Request of Christopher Schlegel late of Saxony but now of this Province that we would grant him to take up one thousand Acres of Land on a Run of Water flowing into Conestogoe Creek not far from y<sup>e</sup> land granted to the Palatines for which he agrees to pay One hundred pounds of lawful Money upon the 25<sup>th</sup> day of next first Month & the usual Quittr<sup>t</sup> of one shilling sterling p hund<sup>d</sup>. These are to Authorize & Require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Christopher Schlegel the said quantity of One thousand Acres of Land in y<sup>e</sup> place afores<sup>d</sup> that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is seated by y<sup>e</sup> Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office which Survey in case the s<sup>d</sup> Christopher comply with the afores<sup>d</sup> Agreement shall be good & valid Otherwise the same to be utterly void together with this Grant. Saving that in case the s<sup>d</sup> Christopher shall by the latter end of y<sup>e</sup> third Month (call'd May) next erect on any part of the said Land a sufficient Grist Mill for the service of the adjacent Courtrey, then there shall be abated to him twenty pounds of the afores<sup>d</sup> Consideration. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philad<sup>la</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 28<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> A.D. 1713
