William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Governour in Chief of the Province of Pensylvania and Countys annexed

At the Request of Hugh Roberts Purchaser of One thousand seven hundred and fifty seven Acres under Several of the first Welsh Purchasers of w^{ch} there remains two hundred Acres untaken up also of five hundred Acres under Peter Young that I would grant him to take up Seven hundred Acres of Land the s^d Residue These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the s^d Hugh Roberts according to the Method of Townships by me appointed, the Said Number of Seven hundred Acres in two several places in the Welsh Tract where it has not been yet taken up nor is Concealed nor Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 3^d day of the seventh Month 1701,
