Upon an Agreement made with John Rumford late of Ireland  
~~For~~ For Three Hundred acres of Land on the West Side of  
 the River Struykill above T. Millers Mill for which he hath  
 agreed to pay to the Proprietors Use after the rate of Twelve  
 pounds for each hundred with common Quittrent Twenty pounds  
 thereof in the third Month next and the Remainder, in ye  
 fall following with Interest from the said third Month. These  
 are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be  
 Survey'd to the said John Rumford According to the Method  
 of Townships appointed the said quantity of Three hun-  
 dred acres of Land in the Said place that has not been  
 already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the  
 Indians. and make Returns into the Secretaries Office.  
 Which Survey in case the said John fulfill the agreement afore-  
 sd shall be valid, otherwise the same shall be Void and of no  
 effect, as if it had never been made nor this Warrt ever  
 Granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the  
 Province at Philadelphia the 19<sup>th</sup> day of the first Month  
 170<sup>3/4</sup>
