William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^t in Chief of
the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed

At the Request of John Sharpless That I would Grant him to
take up three hundred and fourteeⁿ Acres of Land in right
of his ffather Jn^o Sharpless's purchase of one thousand Acres
being the remainder untaken up and the full Complem^t
thereof Liberty Land excepted: These are to require thee
~~to Survey~~ to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto him the s^d
Jn^o Sharpless the s^d Number of three hundred and four-
teen Acres according to the Method of Townships by me
appointed, in the first Township that shall be laid out in
the County of Chester after the date hereof, of Land that has
not been already Survey'd nor taken up, nor is concealed
nor seated by the Indians, and make Return^s thereof
into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and
Seal at Philad^a the 21st day of the 12th moth 170⁹
