By Vertue of a Warrt from the late Comm<sup>rs</sup> of Property dated the 17<sup>th</sup> of the 6<sup>th</sup> Month 1702 authorizing & requiring 250<sup>ac</sup> to be laid out to Jn<sup>o</sup> Rob<sup>ts</sup> of Merion in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> in right of divers persons who came Serv<sup>ts</sup> into this Province as in the said Warr<sup>t</sup> is mentioned There was surveyd on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1726 one Tract in the Townp of New Brit<sup>n</sup> in the County of Bucks the right whereof is now vested in Thomas Edw<sup>ds</sup> Begin<sup>g</sup> contain<sup>g</sup> 100<sup>ac</sup> & a small Allowance for Roads &c
