At the Request of David Lloyd That we would grant him to take up six hundred and sixty six acres and two thirds of an acre of Land in this Province being ~~two~~ One Third of two thousand acres remaining untaken up of John Barber's Original Purchase of two thousand five hundred Acres W<sup>ch</sup> said Third part the said David hath purchased of the said Barber's Copy De Relict and Sole Exec<sup>ts</sup> Elizabeth Webb: These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out to the said David Lloyd according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of six hundred sixty and six acres and two thirds of an acre of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor ~~is~~ concealed nor is Seated by the Indians, and make Returns into the General Surveyors office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be deliv<sup>d</sup>. to thee certified by y<sup>e</sup> Secretary.
