him a Resurvey on a certain Tract of Land in the County
of Philadelphia in the Township commonly called Whit-
pains laid out to him for 300 acres in right and as part

acres to his brother W^m Palmer: Also on another Tract

Elizabeth now wife to Ralph Jackson: These are to re-
quire thee forthwith to Resurvey or cause to be Resurvey'd
the said three Tracts severally according to their first Bounds
and lines of Survey and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries
