*At the Request of David Lloyd Executor of the last Will and Testament of Thomas Lloyd Dec<sup>d</sup> that we would grant him to take up in the County of Chester the quantity of three hundred and twenty nine acres of Land in lieu of the like quantity by him and the other Execut<sup>s</sup> Relinquished in the Great Valley to Crocon Swaffer and Bowater, These are to Authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be Survey<sup>d</sup> for the Use of the Descendants of the Said Thomas Lloyd in the Said County of Chester according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of three hundred twenty nine Acres of Land that has not been already Survey<sup>d</sup> nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys office in order for a further Confirmation. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 22<sup>d</sup> day of Novemb<sup>r</sup> 1717*
