


By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 26th day of Sept 1702 directed to David Powel and Isaac Taylor or either of them for laying outto David Lloyd one thousand acres of Land granted to the said David Lloyd by his father in Law Joseph Growdon

Survey'd the ~~the~~ 20th of the 11th Month 1702 unto ^{yest} David Lloyd the quantity of one thousand acres of land in the County of Chester beginning at a black oak in the Welch line and Extending thence by a line North North West three hundred and sixty perches to a post then by other land of the Said Lloyd East by North four hundred and fifty four perches to a post then south South east three hundred and sixty perches to a post Then by the said Welch line west by south four hundred and fifty four perches to the beginning
