Whereas Francis Cook Exec^t of the last Will & Testam^t of Frances Claypoole (who was purchaser of Ten thousand acres of Land in this Province) hath made application unto us for two thousand acres of Land part of the s^d Purchase These are therefore to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the s^d Francis Cook in right of the s^d James Claypoole according to the Method of Townships appointed the full quantity of one thousand acres of Land in this Province that has not been already surveyed nor concealed nor taken up nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's Office Given under our hands & seal of the Province the Eleventh day of the Twelfth Month in the Year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred & Eleven
