 Courses thereof One hundred and Twenty Five perches to a Post thence
 West by South Thirty two perches to a Black Oak thence South west Twenty
 six Perches to a hickery Tree by the s^d River thence up the same
 Traversing the Several Courses thereof Two hundred and Eighty Perches
 to the Place of Beginning Containing six hundred acres with the Usual allow-
