

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of Property dated the first day of May 1719 Surveyd for Richard Gregory A Tract of Land Situate on Manatawney Creek near Oley in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> Begining at a post at a Corner of Anthony Lee's Land thence North East by the Same two Hundred & forty pches to a white Oak, Thence North West by Vacant land one Hundred forty one pches and a half to a post thence South West by Vacant land two Hund<sup>d</sup> and forty pches to a post Thence <sup>South East</sup> by Vacant land and the Land of the S<sup>d</sup> Anthony Lee one Hundred and forty one pches and a half to the place of Begining Contairing two Hundred acres <sup>with Six p. Cent</sup> Surveyd the 5<sup>th</sup> — obliterated — 19
