

Pennsylvania, ss.

By Virtue of a General Warrant bearing Date the 25th Day of November 1748. I have caused to be Surveyed on the 8th day of October 1749 to the use of the Honourable the Proprietaries a Certain Tract of Land Situate on Kind Creek beyond the Blue Mountains in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post standing on the said Kind Creek and from thence extending by Vacant Land the eight Courses and Distances next following Viz^t: North one hundred and twenty five perches to a marked white oak. East Two hundred and forty one perches to a marked white oak, South forty Deg^s. West one hundred and four perches to a Stone, South eighty Degrees East two hundred and eighty one perches to a marked white oak, South Two Hundred & seven Perches to a marked white oak. North Seventy Degrees West Two hundred and ninety Perches to a marked white oak, South twenty Deg^s West Seventy three perches and a half to a marked white oak, and North Seventy Degrees West one hundred and fifty perches to a post standing on the said Kind Creek, thence down the same on the several courses thereof to the place of Beginning Containing Five hundred and eighty two Acres and a half and the usual allowance of six acres & c^t. for Roads &c^a. Returned into the Secretarys Office the Second Day of January Anno Dom. 1755.
