

Pennsylvania, ss-

By Virtue of a General Warrant to me directed bearing Date the 25<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1748. I have caused to be Surveyed on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of November 1749 for the use of the Honourable the Proprietaries a Certain Tract of Land situate on a large branch of Swatara Creek formerly in the County of Lancaster now in the County of Berks, Beginning at a marked white Pine standing in a line of Land laid out for the use of the said Proprietaries, and from thence extending by Vacant Land the five Courses and Distances next following Viz: East Five Hundred perches to a marked Chesnut oak. South Four Hundred and fifty two perches to a marked white oak. West Two Hundred and forty eight Perches to a marked white oak. South Forty four perches and a half to a marked white oak. & South eighty Degrees West Two Hundred and fifty six perches to a post. thence by Vacant Land and Land laid out to the use of the said Proprietaries North five hundred and forty one perches to the place of Beginning. Containing One thousand Four Hundred and thirty one Acres and the usual allowance of six Acres & Cent for Roads &c. Returned into the Secretarys Office the Second Day of January Anno Dom: 1755.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this tenth day of May 1910.
