

Pennsylvania. ss.

By Virtue of a General Warrant bearing Date the 25th Day of November 1748. I have caused to be Surveyed on the 29th Day of November 1749 to the use of the Honourable the Proprietaries a Certain Tract of Land on Swahatrawra Creek beyond the Blue Mountains formerly in the County of Lancaster now in the County of Berks. Beginning at a post in a line of a Tract of Land laid out to the said Proprietaries, and from thence extending by the same and Vacant Land North seven hundred and seventy nine perches to a post. thence by Vacant Land the eight Courses and Distances next following. Viz: South eighty Degrees West forty seven perches to a marked white oak. South fifty Degrees West Three hundred and seventy six perches to a marked white oak. South ten Degrees East One hundred and fifty seven perches and a half to a marked white oak. South twenty Degrees West One hundred and seventy four perches to a marked white oak. South eighty Degrees West forty two perches to a marked Hickery Sapling. South twenty Degrees East One hundred and eighty eight perches to a marked white oak. South eighty Degrees East One hundred and four perches to a stone. and East Three hundred and forty perches to the Place of Beginning Containing One thousand Seven Hundred & seventy two Acres, and the usual allowance of Six Acres & Cent for Roads &c^e Returned into the Secretarys Office the Second Day of January Anno Dom: 1755.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this tenth day of May 1910.
