

Pennsylvania. 55.

By Virtue of a Warrant Dated the 31st Day of December 1733, there was Surveyed on the 18th Day of April 1740 to the Use of the Honourable the Proprietaries a Certain Tract of Land Situate in Cumru Township formerly in the County of Lancaster now in the County of Berks. Beginning at a marked Black oak standing on a small Run about twelve perches from the Mouth thereof and from thence extending by Land formerly laid out and Leased to Peter Rambo and others North West one hundred and twenty perches to a marked Red oak, and South West forty perches to a marked black oak, thence by Edward Price's Land North West one hundred and twenty two perches to a marked Hickery, thence by Henry Harry's Land East North East Three hundred and ten perches to a marked Ash tree, standing on the said Schuylkill River, thence down the same on the several Courses thereof to the Mouth of the aforesaid Run, thence up the said ^{Run} on the several Courses thereof to the place of Beginning Containing Two Hundred and forty five Acres and the usual allowance of six Acres & Cent for Roads &c. Returned into the Secretarys Office the 14th day of January Anno Dom: 1754.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this tenth day of May 1910.
