Whereas by your Consent and Direction a Survey was made
 on a certain Tract of Land containing One hundred &
 twenty five Acres & 53 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres. Situate in Haycock Township
 in the County of Bucks part of the Lottery Land. ~~the right to which~~
~~is now lawfully vested~~. for Christian Puss of the County of Bucks
 aforesaid, who hath requested that we would grant him the said
 Land and agreed to pay to our Use the sum of Sixty Pounds per cent
 with lawful Interest for the same, and the Yearly Quit Rent of One
 half Penny Sterling & Acre both to commence from the first
 Day of March 1768.

These are therefore to authorise and require you to accept and receive
 into your Office the Survey of the said Tract, and make Return
 thereof into the Secretaries Office, for the Use and Behoof of the
 said Christian Puss in order for further Confirmation, for which
 this shall be your sufficient Warrant: Which Survey, in Case the said
 Christian Puss fulfill the above Agreement within one Month after
 the Date here of shall be valid, otherwise the same is to be void.
