

Whereas I have received information of some Encroachments being made on our Manor of Gilberts in the County of Philadelphia; and being willing to know the true limits & Boundaries thereof, as it was first laid out; I do hereby order thee to call upon William Moor at his House, who will instruct thee in some Particulars relating thereto. And that thou dost likewise inform thy self, by all the Means possible, whether any alterations have been made in the original lines of that Manor; What they are? When done? and by Whom? and make a faithfull report to me thereof. Given under my Hand at Philadelphia this 24<sup>th</sup> day of Octob<sup>r</sup> 1733.
