

By virtue of a warrant from Edward Pennington Surveyor General bearing date the 4th of the 8th mo. 1700. directed unto me I do hereby certify into his office that I have surveyed and laid out unto the proprietor and Governors proper use and behoof the 8th of (obl.) in ensuing a certain tract of land in the township (obl.) Linnbrook in the county of Philadelphia beginning at a (obl.) by a street or road running through the said township from (obl.) by a line of marked trees dividing it from Joseph Riks land (obl.) south west five hundred perches to a post set in the ground from (obl.) there north west by a line of marked trees one hundred and sixty perches to another post set in the ground from there north east by a line of marked trees five hundred perches to a post by the said street or road and by the same south east (obl.) line of marked trees one hundred and sixty perches to the post of beginning containing and laid out for five hundred acres (obl.) land.
