These are to authorize and require Thee to survey or cause to be surveyed a tract of land on the Branches of Marsh Creek on the West side of the River Sasquahanna in the County of Lancaster containing about Thirty Thousand acres for our own proper Use and Behoof and the same to return under the name and style of our Manor of Maske in the County of Lancaster aforesaid into our Secretary's Office and for so doing this shall be thy sufficient Warrant Given under my Hand and the seal of our Land Office at Philadelphia this eighteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One Thousand seven Hundred and Forty One.
